## **Definitions of terms**

**Policy:** It is a government's formal statement guiding decisions and actions in a specific area or on a particular issue. It serves as a framework for decision-making, offering direction to achieve objectives.

**Act:** Is a formal written law that is binding and enforceable on all individuals and entities within the jurisdiction governed by that legislative body. It sets out rules, regulations, rights, and obligations on various matters of public concern, such as governance, commerce, social welfare, and criminal justice.

**Regulation:** A rule or order issued by a government agency and often having the force of law.
